Pets thrive with healthy mouths

Every time I go to the dentist, I'm amazed at how much tartar the hygienists have to scrape off my teeth, and I brush my teeth twice a day! Now, think of a dog or cat that hasn't had dental care in years. The majority of pets six years and older have significant periodontal disease, with layers of plaque building up over time. Underneath that plaque live bacteria that produces toxins, which can lead to inflammation of the gums, also known as gingivitis. If left untreated, gingivitis can

progress to periodontal disease – **a very painful condition** for pets. It is easy to underestimate the extent of periodontal disease because our furry friends often still eat and do not outwardly appear to be in pain. However, dogs and cats have a very strong survival instinct. They keep eating because their bodies need food to continue living. By the time an animal stops eating, it means the pain is more severe than is the will to survive and eat.

The good news is that there is a lot that you can do to help prevent dental disease:

- Daily brushing of teeth is the gold standard for home care plaque control in dogs and cats. Ideally, the daily routine should be introduced when your pet is young and healthy. A child-sized, soft-bristled toothbrush and dog/cat toothpaste in the desired flavor is all you need to start. Introduce your pet to this process slowly, and make it a very positive experience. Your pet will be happier! (PLEASE NOTE: do not start brushing the teeth of an animal with existing dental disease, as it can be very painful.)
- Eastside performs a dental health assessment during wellness exams on all patients. These assessments are a must because many cases of dental disease can be diagnosed on a non-sedated patient. And, like most diseases, early intervention means a better outcome!
- Regular veterinary dental cleanings help prevent dental disease.
 The importance of an oral exam on an anesthetized patient can't be emphasized enough. A lot of dental disease happens below the gum line,

Top 10 reasons to bring your cat to Eastside

1. Cats keep secrets!

Your cat will not show signs of serious illness until he or she just can't hide it any longer. Many medical problems, such as kidney disease, thyroid disease, bladder conditions, etc., can be found early and treated through **annual wellness exams.**

2. Eastside is a "feline-friendly" practice.

3. Nobody wants Rabies.

Cats are just as susceptible to rabies as any other mammal, and annual vaccinations are required by law (even for 100 percent indoor cats). There is no treatment for rabies in pets; only prevention.

Cats don't pee on things because they're mad at you. Inappropriate urination can be a symptom of a medical problem, such as urinary tract infection, bladder stones, or crystals.

5. Cats keep secrets! See #1.

6. Your cat's kisses smell like dead fish.

Bad breath just isn't a "normal thing" for cats. Mouth odor can be an indicator of dental disease or other treatable medical issues.

7. Vomit doesn't match your décor.

Are you finding vomit all over the carpet? It could be chronic hairballs or a continued on page 3

On My Mind

I've been worried about ticks for a long time. Let's be honest, those grape-sized, mushy hitchhikers hanging off of our canine or feline friends are disgusting, and the sneaky, creepy-crawly, little spidery rascals that crawl into their fur, often undetected, are no better!! The horrible news about ticks is that they can cause serious

disease in both pets and people. No human or companion animal wants to be afflicted with the life-long consequences of chronic Lyme Disease or other vector borne diseases.

However, I have some good news. Through scientific advances, detection and screening for tick-borne disease in dogs has never been easier. In November of 2015, Eastside began using the **Accuplex 4 test** through Antech Diagnostic Labs as our routine **heartworm/vector borne disease-screening tool** for canine patients. This test has the advantage of screening for three diseases carried by ticks: **Lyme Disease**, **Ehrilichiosis**, and **Anaplasmosis**. Much to our surprise, we have had a number of positive cases from Southern Indiana. We are more passionate than ever about tick control and the prevention of diseases caused by ticks.

Along with the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), we recommend the following:

- Use tick control products consistently for ALL dogs and cats.
 For maximum protection, high-risk pets may need more than one type of product. Ask us for details.
- Check your pets daily for ticks, especially after pets spend time outdoors.
- Remove ticks immediately. Watch Dr. Lisa Powell give a
 demonstration on YouTube at: www.youtube.com/

- Restrict access to tick habitats in your yard (including warm, shady tree areas or areas with tall grass).

Additional Note: We now recommend the Lyme Vaccine for all dogs who hike, spend time in the woods, or travel. The initial inoculation series for Lyme Disease prevention is two injections, 2-4 weeks apart, followed by annual boosters. If you are interested in having your dog vaccinated against Lyme Disease, please call us as soon as possible.

where it is difficult to see without probing and X-rays, and these diagnostic procedures require sedation. Frequently, disease can be identified and treated during the process of an assessment procedure.
